5.	46 of 50 states collect statistics on the number of abortions that occur within the state. This data is often used to evaluate the effectiveness of family planning programs and efforts to reduce teen pregnancy. Would you support an abortion-reporting requirement that ensures the privacy of the patient?

	Support for Pregnant Women
6.	Pro-life charities known as pregnancy resource centers (PRCs) work tirelessly in Maryland's communities to help women in need overcome perceived obstacles to carrying a pregnancy to term. Among other things, PRCs provide counseling, emotional support, and material assistance at no cost to their clients. Maryland's pro-life PRCs do not receive any subsidies from the state. They do not provide or refer for abortions and some choose not to provide or refer for contraception.
	In 2009–2010, two local bills targeting pro-life pregnancy resource centers in Baltimore City and Montgomery County were passed in spite of the fact that the impacted PRCs have never received a bona fide complaint from an actual client and are highly regarded in their communities. Family planning centers that do provide or refer for abortions and/or contraception (i.e., Planned Parenthood) were excluded from regulation under the bills. The Baltimore City law was later declared unconstitutional. The Montgomery County law has been stayed pending a decision in that constitutional challenge. Similar legislation was introduced in both the Maryland House of Delegates and the Maryland Senate in 2008, but no votes occurred in either committee after presentation of overwhelming opposition.
	Would you support the repeal of Health Article §3-501 through §3-506, and Article 1 §40-14 (e) (7) and §41-14 (6), in Baltimore, which exclusively regulate the protocol of pro-life pregnancy resource centers which do not provide or refer for abortions or contraception? YESX NO
