# Chair's Report



Just because the November elections have passed doesn't mean there isn't any electoral activity until 2012. As is usual in odd-numbered years, municipalities in Maryland will be holding elections for some or all of their offices. There are 157 self-governing

municipalities in the state. You can see the list here:

www.msa.md.gov/msa/mdmanual/01glance/html/mun.html You can view the calendar of state municipal elections here: www.msa.md.gov/msa/mdmanual/01glance/html/munelect.html You can also get to the Maryland Municipalities webpage by going to the state website, Maryland.gov, click on the link to the Maryland Manual Online on the right side of the page, then click on the link to the Maryland Municipalities page near the bottom of the screen.

These are races that are winnable *now*. The Libertarian Party currently has 156 people in elected office in the U.S., and many of these are at the municipal level.

MdLP vice-chair Muir Boda is running for the Salisbury City Council, for the second time. After his first run, Muir was appointed to the recycling committee, and has been a regular attendee of the city council meetings. He frequently has letters-to-the-editor published in the *Salisbury Daily Times*, and has positioned himself to have a solid chance at getting elected.

The primaries for the Salisbury City Council are on March 1. The top six vote-getters advance to the general election, which will be held on April 5 – the top three will serve on the council. You can view Muir's campaign site here: Boda4Salisbury.com

I can also put you in touch with a Libertarian who has been elected to municipal office, and is currently serving.

I hope you will be able to join us for the annual MdLP spring convention, being held on Saturday, 12 March, at *Squire's Italian Restaurant* in Dundalk. As always, we will have excellent speakers joining us, including:

- Ken Krawchuk is a former chair of the Pennsylvania LP, two-time former LP candidate for Governor there, and will be discussing his new book *Atlas Snubbed*, which details shortcomings of the Objectivist philosophy and how they have hurt the Libertarian message, and why we should promote a new strategy: the separation of society and state.
- Jim Lark, former Libertarian National Committee chair, current region 5 representative, and professor at the University of Virgina. He will be discussing "Knee-Jerk Libertarianism: A Cure for a Common Disease."
- Len Lazarick is the editor and publisher of MarylandReporter.com, the premier website on politics in Maryland. He will tell us how we can get more media attention.
- James Bovard is a Libertarian author, and a frequent guest on talk shows across the country, including the Ron Smith Show on WBAL-AM. James Bovard is the author of nine books, and has written for many publications.

We submitted 13,787 signatures to the BoE on January 10. They postponed the turn-in date until March 7, so continue collecting signatures until we post that we have been approved.

James Boyard is the author of nine books, including Attention Deficit Democracy, The Bush Betrayal, and Lost Rights: The Destruction of American Liberty . He has written for the New York Times, Wall Street Journal, Playboy, Washington Post, New Republic, Reader's Digest, and many other publications. He is a contributing editor for American Conservative magazine and The Freeman and a regular contributor to Freedom Daily magazine. The Wall Street Journal called Bovard "the roving inspector general of the modern state." the New York Times tagged him "an anti-czar Czar," and George Will called him a "one-man truth squad." Lost Rights received the Free Press Association's Mencken Award as Book of the

Year. His writings have been publicly denounced by the chief of the FBI, the Secretary of Agriculture, the Secretary of HUD, the Postmaster General, and the chiefs of the U.S. International Trade Commission, the DEA, and FEMA, as well as by many congressmen and other malcontents.

Ken Krawchuk has been a registered Libertarian for almost twenty years. He's run for public office eight times, including two record-breaking campaigns for Governor of Pennsylvania, and has served two terms as Chair of the Libertarian Party of Pennsylvania. He's also an award-winning Distinguished Toastmaster, a professional public speaker, and a freelance writer. His first full-length novel, Atlas Snubbed, is a parody sequel to Ayn Rand's Atlas Shrugged, and is due for release later this year. The novel focuses on certain shortcomings of Rand's Objectivist philosophy and how those failings have adversely impacted the Libertarian message, then presents a brand new political solution to them - the separation of society and state - which is also the topic of his talk.





Len Lazarick is the editor and publisher of MarylandReporter.com, a news site on state government and politics which has won regional and national journalism awards. Len was formerly the State House bureau chief of the daily Baltimore Examiner from its start in April 2006 to its untimely demise in February 2009. In the 1980's, Len was State House chief and political editor of *Patuxent Publishing*, then a chain of 13 weeklies, and in 1997 was senior associate producer at Maryland Public Television for coverage of State House hearings. He has been an editor at numerous publications large and small, including The Washington Post, Patuxent Publishing, The Business Monthly, and the Trustee Quarterly. Len has been a regular commentator on Baltimore talk radio as well as the Baltimore cable TV news show ReportersRoundtable.com

Longtime MdLP friend Jim Lark presents "Knee-Jerk Libertarianism: A Cure for a Common Disease." He will give examples of how Libertarians engage in knee-jerk behavior that scares away people who should be allies, and suggest ways to cure the disease.
