Young Libertarians of Maryland

We are excited to announce the formation of a new group, designed to empower young libertarians and provide a bridge between the party and the large number of young libertarians who don't yet affiliate with the Libertarian Party.

The Young Libertarians of Maryland held their inaugural meeting on February 4th in Catonsville. The meeting was wellattended and the audience heard from Erin Carrington Smith, who is expected to serve as the Director for the first year, as well as our Chairman, Bob Johnston. Eric Blitz assisted the group with organizational issues. Some people signed up as members immediately that evening, including a few who are brand new to the Party.

Young Libertarians of Maryland will focus on education, social events, promoting youth involvement in libertarianism, electoral and direct political action, outreach to other libertarian groups, and promoting the social and public welfare of the citizens of Maryland through private and voluntary means. Some of the early goals will be to increase membership and to raise funds to begin financing their own events.

While the Libertarian Party of Maryland is sponsoring the group, it is open to anyone thirty-five years old or younger and who resides in Maryland, regardless of party affiliation. Membership in YLM is inexpensive – only \$15 per year (free for those under 18). So if you are age qualified, join YLM and help make this organization a success. We can't let the other parties be the only ones

encouraging the young to organize and participate. You can also contribute to YLM without becoming a member. Please note that YLM is a subsidiary of the Libertarian Party of Maryland, so all contributions are non-deductible political contributions and subject to legal limits.

The next meeting of YLM will be held on March 12th from 7:00 to 8:30 pm at the Catonsville Library. YLM has a Facebook page and twitter account so you can keep up with their activities, and we'll bring you updates on their progress over the coming year. Good luck to our young libertarians!

Letter to the Editor

You solicited comments at the end of Gerry Schneider's Letter to the Editor on the phrase "Freedom is a Primary Value." My own preference to express the same idea is "Individual Liberty is My (or Our) Top Priority." I prefer this formulation because I find that, in talking to people, everyone believes that they are free so they don't understand that there's even an issue. I think the phrase "Individual Liberty" sharpens the issue somewhat and makes them think about it without dismissing it out of hand as they do with the word "Freedom." Also I think that the phrase "Top Priority" is emotionally stronger and more emphatic than the phrase "Primary Value" which, in my opinion, lacks emotional punch and is too intellectual.
